CITIZEN SCIENCE OPPORTUNITIES

STREAM MONITORING TRAINING

Saturday, May 1 - 9:00 am to 11:30 am

In person at the Grass River Center

Twice each year, GRNA monitors several sites along the 3 major streams running through the natural area to assess the health of our waterways. Every year, we train new volunteers to help us collect this data and contribute to keeping GRNA's creeks healthy. If you're interested in learning how to collect this data, join us! Pre-registration is required - email emily@grassriver.org. Please note: most of this training will occur outside, but

masks must be worn inside the Grass River Center.



SPRING STREAM MONITORING

Saturday, May 8 - 9:00 am to 1:00 pm

New and seasoned volunteers of all ages are

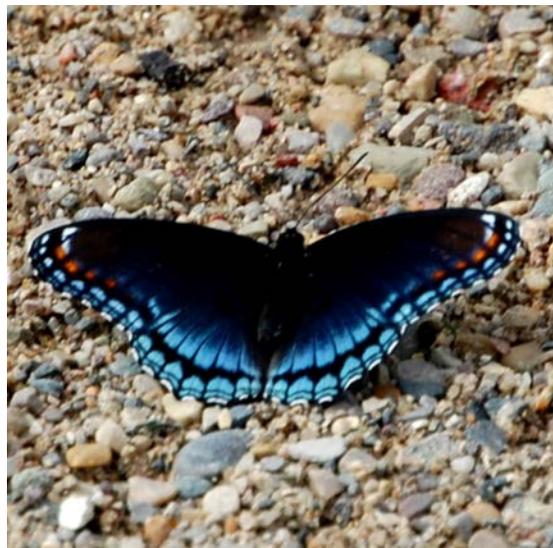
invited to join us as we collect data as part of our biannual stream monitoring program. This year, teams will be collecting habitat data and macroinvertebrates (creek "bugs") at three sites along Shanty Creek and then will return to the Grass River Center to sort through their critter samples. For everyone's safety, we will attempt to sort outside under the pavilion, but if we are forced inside due to weather, masks must be worn. Pre-registration is required - email emily@grassriver.org. Note: we highly encourage new volunteers to attend the Stream Monitoring Training on May 1st to become familiar with collection and sorting methods.

BUTTERFLY MONITORING TRAINING

Online training hosted by Kalamazoo Nature Center

Kalamazoo Nature Center staff will host a virtual butterfly monitoring training for the Michigan Butterfly Network (MiBN). The goal of MiBN is to gather data on the status and distribution of Michigan butterflies using citizen scientists. This free training is open to past and new participants throughout the state of Michigan. Donations are welcome and will help support MiBN's annual operating costs. Register for online training
